

Introduction of Matrix for 2025

In an ongoing effort to investigate new and innovative products, we are pleased to introduce Matrix in 2025 on a limited basis and evaluate its efficacy as a source of nutrition compared to some current standards. Matrix is a branded product with the actual name being polysulfide. which is derived from polybasite, a naturally occurring mineral. This mineral contains the nutrients potassium, magnesium, calcium and sulfur. Existing in sulfate form all these nutrients are readily available and have a low salt index making this product safe for both bulk spreading and in row applications. Growers currently using K-Mag in conjunction with granular gypsum in blends will want to have a look at this product as an alternative. The product contains 13.3% K20, 3.3% Mg, and 11.8% Ca along with 18.2% Sulfur. This product also has organic certification bringing a new tool to this group of growers as well. This will be an introduction year for Holmes Agro with this product and we are looking for growers willing to run side by side comparisons, helping us evaluate this product.

Prepare your Planter for the 2025 Planting Season

The importance of planting in ideal conditions, using the optimal seed variety, and treatment for your ground is emphasized in many agronomic conversations. Preparatory planter maintenance and tune up should not be overlooked during these conversations! Studies show that planter condition affects the quality of stand establishment, and superior stand establishment is critical to optimizing yield.

□ Tire Pressure - under-inflated tires require more revolutions per acre, resulting in higher seeding and fertilization rates. Overinflated tires can cause the opposite!

□ Make sure your planter is level to ensure consistent depth.

Derallel Linkage Arm Wear - check for bushings wear which can result in shallower seed planting depth.

Seed Drop Tubes - these tubes need to be clean with no rough edges which can impact seed drop accuracy.

Disk openers - look for signs of wear. As openers wear and become shorter, they can no longer create a consistent cut into the soil for seed placement and depth.

Depth Gauge Wheels - make sure that they turn freely and move up and down easily to prevent soil from flowing into the seed trench causing inconsistent planting depth.

Seed Drop - Calibrate your planter. Consider planting speed in correlation to seed drops, ensure all chains, and wear parts are within the manufacturer's specifications.

Stop and check your depth, seed drop, and row closure throughout the planting season! Make sure what is happening in the cab matches the field conditions.

Third Party Loan Due Dates

All eligible crop input purchases between Sep 01 /23 and Aug 31 /24 have a repay date **by February 23, 2025** for Scotiabank Yield More financing. Farm Credit Canada (FCC) Crop Input financing is **due by March 15, 2025**. New feature - you can now pay directly through your FCC Online Services account: https://onlineservices.fcc-fac.ca. There is no penalty if you pay early, and funds become available once again.
